## GENERAL RULES

- 1. Competition.** Competition is open only to boys and girls who are enrolled as 4-H Club members or F.F.A. members by June 1st of the current year.  
\*\*The New York State 4-H Club year runs from October 1 to September 30.  
\*\* Youth who are five through eight years of age on or before January 1 of the club year and enrolled in Kindergarten through second grade should enroll as a 4-H Cloverbud member.  
\*\*Youth who have reached their nineteenth birthday before January 1 of the 4-H club year may not enroll as a 4-H member.  
\*\*Persons considered to be mentally challenged may participate fully in 4-H programs as long as their mental age is determined to fall between five and nineteen years of age.
2. Chaperoned dormitories available for exhibitors to sleep overnight. All 4-H members who stay on the grounds are required to sleep in this dormitory. Registration is required each day. Those violating dormitory rules will be subject to loss of all premiums. 4-H members staying overnight at the county fair must stay in the dorm unless written permission is made to the appropriate animal superintendent. If staying elsewhere on the grounds, a dormitory sign-up still needs to be filled out stating where you will be staying. These forms were mailed to you in your Animal Exhibitor/Health letter and can also be obtained at the Youth Building during fair.
3. No entry fee is charged in this department. An entry blank is required only for all dairy, beef, sheep, swine, goat, horse, rabbit, cavy, dog, and poultry classes. **These entries are due July 23 at the 4-H office, Cornell Cooperative Extension, P.O. Box 184, Hamden, NY 13782.**  
**STATE FAIR ENTRIES ARE ALSO DUE ON THIS DATE.**
4. All exhibits in this department will be governed by the same general rules and regulations that apply to all other departments.
5. All exhibits in this department must be in place by:  
**\*Youth Building 7:00 p.m.**  
**\*Animal Exhibits 5:00 p.m.**  
Monday night of fair week and must remain until 8:00 p.m. Saturday. Exhibitors removing items before 8:00 p.m. will forfeit all premiums that may have been awarded.
6. The Society shall take every precaution for the safekeeping of animals and goods of exhibitors, but assumes no responsibility in case of loss or damage, and upon this condition only, are entries received. The Society shall not be liable for injury to any person that may occur to them while on the fairgrounds. Cooperative Extension will assume no responsibility for the loss or damage of articles accepted to represent Delaware County at the State Fair.
7. The Board of Directors requires that all articles or animals exhibited at the Fair shall be kept on the grounds until released. Persons removing animals or articles from the grounds without permission of the Secretary shall forfeit any premium that may have been awarded.
8. Any exhibitor who intentionally damages an exhibit or property of another exhibitor, or whose conduct on the grounds is undesirable, may be requested to forfeit all awards and prize money, and may be requested to remove all his/her property from the fairgrounds at once.
9. All exhibits must be the work of the person exhibiting. Any exhibit raised, made or prepared for exhibit by anyone other than the exhibitor may be disqualified.
10. Failure to abide by any rules set forth by the Superintendents or Assistant Superintendents will subject an exhibitor to forfeit all premiums.
11. **All Youth Building projects will be judged on Monday between 10:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. AND BEFORE they are put on display. Each exhibitor is responsible for presenting his or her exhibit to the judge.**

**Ribbon and Placing Information:** 4-H judging is done on a Danish System of blue, red and white ribbons. Based upon a given set of standards, projects may be awarded all blue ribbons if the judge feels that all entries are above the average for that group. The judge usually awards a combination of blue, red and white ribbons. (i.e. excellent/blue ribbons; average/red ribbons; below the standard/white ribbons). In addition, in animals versus vegetables or clothing, judging the blues, reds and whites are usually arranged in order (ex. 1<sup>st</sup> blue, 2<sup>nd</sup> blue, 1<sup>st</sup> red,
