Choose Class number CAREFULLY. Judges will NOT change entry. Exhibitors must choose section and class that best suits their entry.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- A. Exhibitor must live or own property in Delaware County.
- B. **THERE ARE NO ENTRY FEES.**
- C. No article shall be exhibited if it has previously been exhibited at this fair.
- D. Prizes will only be given when deserving, whether there be competition or not. When deserving, more than one Blue Ribbon may be given.
- E. **ALL entries must remain until 8 p.m. Saturday.** Exhibitor must present the **TAG STUB WHEN PICKING UP EXHIBIT, SATURDAY, 8 p.m. or Sunday 8 a.m. to 12 p.m.** Doors will be closed at 7:30 p.m. Saturday to give attendants time to prepare for pickups.

Standard:

Embroidery is handwork, not liquid embroidery.

- General Appearance: Simple in design and construction, **clean, well pressed, neatly folded or hung.**
- Suitability to intended use.
- Material: Appropriate in quality, design and color.
- Design: Simple and attractive.

Workmanship:

- Padding not heavy. Stitches and edges smooth and even. Stitches of appropriate length.
- Finishing: Back of article neat, corners well made and ends of thread properly held in place. All pictures or samplers must be framed and properly wired.
 - To determine size, measure the picture or sampler not the frame.
 - State on entry whether self-framed or professionally framed.

Please note: Article should be presented clean.

Antique quilts are for display only, at your own risk. Limited to three per year.

Exhibits will be judged on:

- General appearance: attractiveness, cleanness, pressing
- Suitability for intended use: material, size of thread, style or design, color
- Workmanship: evenness of stitches, smoothness of work, finish of corners and back of article, joining of threads

***Note:** Sampler classes in all needlework should include a set of letters and numbers and a variety of stitches.
