- Please follow the Cattle BVD testing regulations as outlined in The Rules & Regulations. Health Regulations Governing the Exhibition of Cattle at the Delaware County Fair are listed in the front of this premium book.
- A state vet will check each animal. If there is a question, the decision of the state vet and the Superintendent will be final. The vet will be checking animals periodically throughout the week.
- Animals must be health checked before entering barns. Following clearance by veterinarians, cattle will be allowed to enter barns.
- <u>No Sleeping in Barn</u>. Any special requests must be submitted to the superintendent in writing with your entry. Please include your reason for sleeping in barn.
- <u>Barn will close to public at 11 p.m.</u> Lights will be turned off.
- Exhibitors may build partitions, stalls, and decorations within their allotted area, using the tie rail, partition down the middle of the barn. Please take these partitions, decorations, etc. home with you at the end of the fair so that the stalls can be cleaned with the bucket loader. DO NOT leave anything in the rafters at the end of the fair.
- <u>No Nailing, Screwing or bolting to the barn</u> <u>structure, including rafters and poles.</u>

All animals entered for premium must be on the grounds by 5 p.m. Monday, and must remain until 8:00 p.m. Saturday.

- Judging of open class beef cattle will be Thursday afternoon, beginning after the finish of 4-H swine show approximately 2-3 p.m. (4-H beef show is Wednesday, at 9:00 a.m.)
- An exhibitor is the owner appearing on the registration paper for the entry. An exhibitor is further defined, for the purpose of group classes, as any member of an immediate family operating as a beef unit.
- Exhibits not worthy of first prize can be handled at discretion of the judge.
- Exhibitors are required to keep animals, stalls and surrounding areas clean at all times during Fair Week. This rule will be strictly enforced. Failure to abide by these rules will result in forfeiture of premiums.
- All exhibitors of purebred stock are required to present registration papers, health papers and transfer papers, bearing name of owner, to the superintendent when called for
- Proper identification, USDA ear tags, tattoos, is required. and will be checked.
- 4-H Beef Steer Sale will be held Saturday, August 16, 2:00 p.m. at the beef cattle barn. Public invited.
- Cross Breed cattle may be exhibited provided they are of complete beef breed.
