**RULES FOR ALL OPEN HORSE SHOW
EXHIBITORS**

Fair entry tickets are only available at the gate.

**Season passes are available at the fair office
after the start of the fair.**

A parking fee of \$15.00 per day is required for campers, as well as horse trailers, motor homes, truck campers and truck tents utilizing electricity. \$5.00 per day for tents. This money

must accompany your entry form to ensure space is available. NO GAS GRILLS OR OPEN FLAME GRILLS ALLOWED.

-This is an open show except for certain classes which are open only to Delaware county residents only

-Exhibitors should look for signs directing them to enter the HORSE-VAN entrance.

-ENTRIES POSTMARKED ON OR BEFORE JULY 25TH 2026 PAY PRE-ENTRY FEE

-ENTRIES POSTMARKED AFTER JULY 25TH 2026 PAY POST ENTRY FEE

A Stall Deposit is required please see entry form

- Stall Fees are \$10.00 per day

-Stabling for horses showing SUNDAY is available after 2pm on Saturday August 15th. Horses showing Sunday must vacate their stalls within one hour of the conclusion of the show.

-Stabling for the remainder of the Open Show is NOT available until 8:00pm on Wednesday.

- Day 1 (HUNTER DAY) is Wednesday 8pm until Thursday 7pm or one hour after the conclusion of the show.

-Day 2 (WESTERN DAY) is Thursday 8pm until Friday 7pm or one hour after the conclusion of the show

-Day 3 (Gymkhana DAY) is Friday 8pm until Saturday 7pm or one hour after the conclusion of the show

All Equines are required to be out of their stalls 1 hour after the conclusion of the show, the exception is Equines showing the following day.

DO NOT DRIVE ON THE GROUNDS AFTER 11PM OR BEFORE 6AM

Tack stalls will be permitted if Stabling allows for it.

NO SMOKING IN ANY HORSE BARN

Proper footwear is required.

No DOGS ALLOWED

No WASHING of Equines in the stable area:
wash racks are provided.

No Grooming, Tying or Cross Tying of Equines in
aisles or doorways of any of the barns.

In effort to encourage exhibitors to send entries
as early as possible to eliminate confusion and
delay in the shows, \$2.00 is added for Post entry
after July 26th,2024. A post entry fee is \$9.00 per
class unless otherwise stated.

Post ENTIES are permitted up to 3 classes prior
to the class entering the ring.

Entries are based on one horse, rider
combination.

Each Show reserves the right to Split or
Combine Classes based on the number of riders
per class.

Entry Fees will be refunded upon the receipt of
a veterinary note certifying lameness or illness
of the equine.

OFFICE FEE, STABLING FEE, CAMPING FEES are
NON-REFUNDABLE.

Stallions may not show in any JR, Walk Trot or
Beginner Class

- An uncut equine 9 months of age are
considered to be Stallions.

- No Stallions are allowed on the grounds
before 8pm on Wednesday or after the
conclusion of Sundays show. No
Stallions are permitted stabling in the 4-
H Barn, prior to Wednesday 8pm,
exception is Sunday's show. Stabling of
Stallions will be up to the discretion of
the Open Show Chair.

Horse Measurement:

Under 14-1 hands is considered a western pony

Under 14-2 hands is considered a hunter pony.

Equitation classes are open to both horses and
ponies, if a pony division is offered ponies may
not show in all other classes, they must stay in
their division, except for equitation classes.

CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS will be awarded per
class, regardless of the number of entries as
follows:

1st place= 7pts, 2nd place= 5pts, 3rd place=4pts,
4th place= 3pts, 5th place= 2pts, 6th place=1pt

Championship ties will be broken at the judge's discretion, Judges' Decision will be final.

If a general rule of this show does not apply, then AQHA and USEF rules will apply. Any disputes or questions shall be addressed with the Division chair.

Any discourtesy to the Horse Show Committee will be grounds for dismissal from the grounds. Under no circumstances should the judge be approached by an exhibitor without permission from the steward or Open Show Chair.

No unauthorized people may enter the horse show ring, except for in an emergency.

OUT OF STATE HEALTH RULES

Equine stabled outside of New York State MUST present a negative Coggins test certificate dated within 30 days of your arrival in New York from your local veterinarian and proof of rabies vaccination 14 days prior to the date of the show, not over one year. Address for the fair is 12 fair street Walton NY 13856

NEW YORK STATE HORSE

Equines must have proof of a rabies vaccination 14 days prior to the date of the show, not over one year. All Equines must have proof of a negative Coggins (EIA Test) dated from 9/24 to 8/26.

ALL COGGINS AND RABIES WILL BE CHECKED BEFORE ENTERING THE FAIR GROUNDS. **DO NOT SEND COGGINS AND RABIES PROOF WITH ENTRY FORMS!**

NEGATIVE TEST FOR EQUINE INFECTIOUS ANEMIA REQUIRED. On and after its inception, July 1, 1973, no horse or other member of the family Equidae six months or more of age shall be admitted to or permitted to be present on the premises where an agricultural fair or New York

State Fair is held during the period of such fair unless the owner or custodian of the horse has filed with the secretary of the fair a certificate of statement showing that the horse or other member of the family Equidae has been negative to an agar gel immunodiffusion test for Equine Infectious Anemia (swamp fever) during the calendar year in which the fair is held or during the preceding calendar year.

1. The agar gel immunodiffusion test must have been conducted by a laboratory approved for the purpose by The United States Department of Agriculture and the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets.
2. The certificate or statement required by subdivision (a) shall include a complete identification of the animal, date of test, and name and address of the laboratory that conducted the test. The certificate or statement must be signed by (1) a duly licensed veterinarian, or (2) the director of a laboratory where the test was conducted, or (3) the chief animal health officer of the animal's state of origin, or (4) in the case of a horse owned and harbored in the State of New York by a county agricultural agent.

Neither the Delaware County Fair nor the Horse Show Committee can accept responsibility for any injury or accident occurring to horse or rider on the fairgrounds.

DRIVING, MINI AND ENGLISH SHOW HORSE CLASS RULES

1. Single Pleasure Driving – Equine to be hitched to a safe suitable 2 or 4 wheeled vehicle in light harness. To show at a walk, trot and extended trot, to stand quietly (headers allowed) and may be asked to back.
2. Pony classes are open to any equine measuring under 14.2h.
3. Mini classes open to any equine measuring 38" & under.
4. Under saddle classes are open to English Show horses only (western).
5. Class 5 – no entry fee – to have placed 1st or 2nd in classes 1-4.
6. Class 43 – no entry fee – to have placed 1st or 2nd in class 41 or 42.
7. Pleasure Driving Reinsman ship – 9, 14, 32 to drive a pattern only – no rail work.
8. Class 6 – Bridle Path Hack – SS, Hunt seat, Western – To be shown at a walk, trot, extended trot, canter and hand gallop.
9. Saddle Seat horses to show at a walk, trot & canter. May be asked to extend. May be asked to back. Judged on performance, quality and manners.
10. Open Versatility Pleasure – 30 – to be judged as a pleasure class 50/50. A rider need not be the same. Start in Western. Open to all Equines to include any style of English.
11. Jr. Riders/drivers are 17 years of age and under as of December 1, 2023.
12. Minis may show in pony classes.
13. Open Beginner Reinsman ship – 32- whip in their first or second year of showing driving. Pattern only – no rail work.
14. Header or Groom will be allowed in the ring only after it has been announced, and horses are in line.
15. AT ALL TIMES THE EQUINE IS PUT TO A CART, BRIDLE MUST BE PROPERLY IN PLACE AND LINES RUN THROUGH TURETS OF HARNESS.
16. Riders/Drivers 17-years-old and under must wear an approved safety helmet while riding or driving.
17. Drivers 13-years-old and under must have a responsible adult in the carriage at all times.
18. Water glass class -31- fun class occupant in carriage holds glass & winner has spilled the least.
19. Classes 3 & 4 – In-hand shown in a bridle. Unless 2 or under

HUNTER DIVISON RULES:

1 Halter horses to be shown in-hand in a bridle unless 2 or under.

2 Showmanship- Shown in-hand in a bridle to be judged 50% presentation, 40% turn out, 10% conformation.

3 Age of the Rider for this show is Dec 1, 2025

4 Equitation is to be judged on seat & hands, ability to manage mount.

5 Pleasure is to be judged walk/Trot or Walk Trot Canter in both directions, may be asked to back.

6 Walk Trot Open to non-professional riders of all ages, not to have shown in any other riding classes that require a canter during this 4-day show. Cross rail height does not exceed 1' at X.

7 Beginner is open to non-professional riders of all ages. To be shown at the walk trot and canter in both directions. Fence heights not to exceed 18" Simple lead changes are allowed Riders can cross enter any division on the flat but cannot jump any course that exceeds 2.'

8 Green Hunter- Open to all riders. Open to any horse or pony that is in its first two years of showing over fences not greater than 2'6" Courses are not to have an in out combination. Any horse in their first or 2nd year of showing that has jumped a height exceeding 2'6" is no longer eligible for green hunter division.

9 Special Hunter- Open to all Riders. Open to horses and ponies Fence height not to exceed 2'3" The combination of horse rider may show in any flat class eligible for but may not jump over 2'3."

10 Low Equitation- Open to all riders of all ages excluding professionals. Riders not to have competed over fences higher than 2'3."

11 Lead line is open to Riders 8 & under, to show only in the lead line classes in this four-day show. The person leading the rider must be 14 years of age or older and must be neatly attired.

12 Best Rider of Delaware County- equitation class open to Delaware County Residents 21 years of age and younger. Will consist of two parts- a flat phase and an over fences phase. Jumps not to exceed 2ft. Once an exhibitor has

won the class, they are not eligible to compete again. Must have three riders to run.

13 Hunter Hack- consist of a minimum of 2 fences max of 3 and to show on the flat

14 Open – Open to all Riders, Horses and Ponies. Fences not to exceed 2'6" at this show.

15 Adult- Open to all riders 18 & over

16 Red/Blue rounds may be purchased for each course ridden, election must be made at time of entry, nonjudged class but feedback may be given at the discretion of the judge.

17 The show committee reserves the right to Split or combine classes as entries warrant. If a class is split, it will be done by age groups. If a class is combined it will be at a fence level, or all ages combined.

1 Horsemanship to be judged on seat, hands and ability to control mount. May be further tested.

2 Pleasure- Judged on the horse shown on a reasonably loose rein at the walk jog and lope both ways of the ring.

3 Showmanship- Judged on 50% showmanship, 25% on conformation, 25% on grooming.

4 Walk Jog riders may only show in Walk Trot or Walk Jog classes over the four days of this show.

5 Age is as of December 1, 2023.

6 Green- is a horse in its 1st or 2nd year of showing western under any rider.

7 Lead line- Rider is 8yrs or younger to show only in lead line classes over the four days of this show Person leading must be 14 years of age and neatly attired. Riders must wear an approved ASTM-sei Helmet.

A Horse or Pony may only be entered once in each class.

You may run into the arena; you must stop before exiting the arena.

A short drag will be done after 10 runs.

A 5 Second penalty will be added for each barrel or pole knocked down; it is legal for the rider to stop the fall of each.

No time is given for the fall of a horse or rider.

A Rider may ride more than one horse in a class.

Reruns will be granted for a timer failure.

Entries close for each class when the first horse of the class enters the ring.

All contestants are subject to the general rules of this four-day show.

Once a contestant is called to the ring, they have one minute to break the timer for their run, in the event of failure to do so no time will be given for that run.

You must check in at the gate for your run two rides out, order of go will be announced and posted.
