B. All exhibits on display in this department must be grown by person making exhibit, except class open to organization. These vegetables to be grown by persons of the organization.

C. All **vegetables** to be plainly **labeled** with variety **NAME**, clean, not to be potted in soil. Chard, dill, parsley and lettuce may be placed in water.

D. Vegetables may be entered in **ONE** class only.

Class No.

- 1 Beans, snap, edible condition, 6 pods, any purple variety, **stems on**
- 2 Beans, snap, edible condition, 6 pods, any green variety, **stems on**
- 3 Beans, snap, edible condition, 6 pods, any yellow variety, **stems on**
- 4 Beans, pole, 6 pods, any variety, stems on
- 5 Beets, 5 any type, top trimmed, not over 2 1/2", tap root trimmed to 1 1/2"
- 6 Beets, Detroit Dark Red type, tops trimmed, not over 2 1/2", tap root trimmed to 1 1/2"
- 7 Broccoli, 1 head
- 8 1 cabbage, Wakefield type, such as Early Jersey Wakefield or Charleston Wakefield

- 13 1 celery, any green or winter sort (Giant Pascal, Easy Blanching, Winter Queen, Columbia, Emperor or Ford hook)
- 14 1 plant chard, not over 2 feet tall

- 15 3 cucumbers, slicing condition, any type, **stems on**
- 16 6 cucumbers, small for pickles, any type, **stems on**
- 17 3 burpless cucumbers, **stems on**
- 18 1 dill plant
- 19 1 eggplant
- 20 Garlic, 3 bulbs, any variety, cured, **roots on stew cut between 1" and 2"**
- 21 3 kohlrabi, ex. White Vienna, Purple Vienna, **tops on**
- 22 1 head lettuce, roots on, clean (Iceberg, New York or Wonderful, Hanson Imperial), crisp head type
- 23 1 lettuce, leaf type, roots on, clean (Grand Rapids, Black Seeded Simpson or Prize head)
- 24 1 lettuce, any other variety roots on
- 25 1 kale plant, **roots on & clean**
- 26 5 onions, any white globe variety, **roots on**
- 27 5 onions, any yellow globe variety, **roots on**
- 28 5 onions, any red globe variety, **roots on**
- 29 5 onions, any flat variety, **roots on**
- 30 1 parsley, **roots on**, clean
- 31 3 peppers, any mild or sweet variety

Awards on classes in displays will be based on the following:

- Quality (uniformity in form, size, color and freedom from blemish)
- Commercial values of varieties
- Completeness of display
- Appearance of display
- Correctness of naming varieties & trueness to type

Class No.

- 63 Best Display to include at least 15 different vegetables, not over three varieties of each vegetable. Open to organizations, societies, clubs, churches, schools, granges or other organizations.

- 64 Best Display: Fresh vegetables at least 10 kinds and display should include 1 of each large vegetable i.e. cabbage, cauliflower and 3 of each small vegetable i.e. beans, beets. **Open to individuals only.**
