All arrangements and exhibits will be judged from a horticultural standpoint. Cut flowers will be judged of blossom and should have reasonable stem length and appropriate foliage. Blossoms should be uniform and of the same color unless otherwise indicated. Please include only the required number of blossoms/stems indicated in each class. Remove blossoms and foliage damaged by insects and rinse away all fertilizer and dirt. May use a preservative.

All flowers entered must be raised by the exhibitor, who must be an amateur grower. Containers must be furnished by the exhibitor, leave your good vase or crystal at home.

Exhibitors may groom, water or replace exhibits any time through the week to maintain quality and freshness of the flowers.
